

Model United Nations

The 3rd Annual ISP MUN entitled 'Sustain to Maintain - Working for the Future' is structured to provide our students with the opportunity to come together and improve their understanding of international issues and political affairs and discover more about Malaysia. The conference will be a unique opportunity for them to make connections from around the world and meet people from different countries and cultures.

"Model United Nations, also known as Model UN or MUN, is an extracurricular activity where students typically roleplay delegates of the United Nations and simulate UN committees [1]". This activity invites the school community to wear business attire and join a real-life committee representing a country's delegation. The objective is to debate with other countries to solve an international issue in a diplomatic manner, following the Charter of the United Nations.

The main purpose of the MUN is to allow students to develop their research, public speaking and debating skills. Additionally, delegates and the Secretariat will learn about leadership and responsibility. Delegates will fulfil their role of representing their given country by thoroughly exploring the issue being debated, while the Secretariat will focus on leading their committees and guiding the delegates' research and performance. Through these experiences, students will become prepared for real-life situations and will be able to defend their opinions based on truthful facts and evidence.

What happens at an MUN?

Participants, known as delegates, are placed into committees to deal with pressing topics that are affecting the future well-being of our world. Each delegate represents the views of a country of the United Nations. Delegates are presented with their assignments in advance, along with a topic or topics that their committee will discuss. They conduct research before the conference and formulate positions to debate with their fellow delegates in the committee.

The delegates' final task during the conference is to agree on a resolution paper with all members of the committee that will need to be approved by the Under Secretary and the General Assembly.

This document will need to include an explanation and outline the actions that would need to be taken to solve the discussed issue. The final objective is to find creative, but realistic solutions for the topic.

The MUN conference encourages participants to learn and build their knowledge of current issues happening in the world around them and develop vital skills in negotiation, public speaking, problem-solving, conflict resolution, research and communication.


Learning Objectives

The 3rd Annual ISP MUN will deliver a unique international and cultural learning experience, enabling students to develop their language skills, share good practice and cultivate long-term friendships across the world.

How to Apply?

We aim to have 150 delegates from 13 to 18 years of age, participating in the ISP MUN. Each region will have a maximum number of delegates. After the deadline date, numbers can be adjusted if there is further demand. Taking into consideration the number of schools and their proximity to Malaysia, the total number of delegates per region will be:

- Europe: 20 delegates
- Mexico & Central America: 20 delegates
- Middle East: 20 delegates
- South America: 10 delegates
- Southeast Asia: 70 delegates
- USA: 10 delegates

Each school should appoint an **MUN Advisor** that will be able to promote and inspire a group of students to join the initiative. The MUN Advisors need to be familiar with Model United Nations conferences and passionate about international affairs.

The MUN Advisor will work with the ISP Regional Team and the ISP Central Team to jointly organise all of the logistics. Depending on the number of delegates per school and region, MUN Advisors will be asked to accompany delegates to Malaysia as chaperones. Chaperone costs will be covered by ISP.

Criteria for registration:

- An ISP school student between 13 and 18 years of age.
- Students need to have been enrolled for at least one full academic year in an ISP school.
- School fees need to be up to date and parents should have no debt with the school.
- Students must have good attendance and exemplary behaviour records.

If a student or group of students are interested in taking part in the ISP MUN, they will need to:

Step 1:

Meet their MUN Advisor who will help them during the application process.

Step 2:

Complete the **Student Application Form** and the **Parental Permission Form**. Please refer to the criteria for registration before completing the forms.

Step 3:

Each MUN Advisor will submit all the **application forms** (Student, Parental and School) no later than **16th December 2019** to their ISP Regional Offices.

Step 4:

Delegates will be confirmed by ISP in early January 2020.

Costs and ISP Support

The costs for attending the 3rd ISP MUN 2020 are:

- Delegate fee (hotel, meals, tours, local transport and conference fee): 550 USD
- Conference fee (for three days of debates only): 150 Malaysian Ringgit
- Flights
- Visas (if required)
- Medical and travel insurance

The Delegate fee should be paid by 24th January 2020.

Travel

Specific designated flights will be agreed in conjunction with the ISP regional teams and schools to Kuala Lumpur. Flights and insurance will be arranged with a designated travel agency. It is the responsibility of parents/guardians to pay for their child's flights and medical and travel insurance.

Parents will be responsible for bringing their children to the designated airport at the agreed time for their flight. At that point, the ISP staff chaperones will take responsibility for the children. They will all be on the same flight to Kuala Lumpur and we will work with the airline to get group seating.

Parents/guardians should also ensure that their child has the necessary valid travel documentation, Visa applications and costs are the responsibility of parents/guardians.

Chaperone costs whilst in Malaysia (accommodation, meals and transport) will be covered by ISP.

Travel arrangements should be confirmed by February 2020.



DAY 7. 16th March:


Trip to Melaka
